- Cream cheese (3 containers)
- butter (1 container)
- Orange juice (3 half gallon containers)
- milk or chocolate milk (1 half gallon container)
- Finger food: fruit, donut holes, cookies

****Please include gluten free / vegan friendly items****

Please include paper goods (plates, napkins, cups, cutlery) as, the school **does not** provide the paper goods

ADDITIONAL NOTE: On the morning of the Rosh Hodesh or Bar/Bat Mitzvah service, parents are asked to arrive at school by 7:45am in order to set up the breakfast in the designated room. The teachers are not responsible to set up

2) Cream cheese needs to have a reliable kosher symbol. Brands which are acceptable are *Tempte* and *Philadelphia*.

3) Any other packaged goods should also have a reliable kosher symbol (OU, Kof-K, Star-K) Entenmann's baked goods are fine and always a hit with middle schoolers.

4) Any prepared food product brought into the school must be labeled with one of the following *Kashrut* symbols:

	Star-K Kosher Certification
	Star-D
	KOF-K Kosher Supervision

5) You'll need to bring paper goods – paper plates, paper cups, napkins, knives and spoons.
